K-3 Reading Levels as Labels?

Developing a love of reading is one of the most important things we can do for our children. In order to foster this love of reading, our teachers need to clearly understand a child's reading needs. So, what does this mean for your child? Teachers will assess your child's reading three times a year (Fall, Winter, Spring) in order to determine how to organize their instruction to meet your child's needs.

"Leveled books are instructional tools for teachers who understand them—nothing more. Above all else, a level is a teacher's tool, not a child's label." Fountas & Pinnell Research

As we shift our focus from using reading levels to a label for students to a tool for teachers, third grade parents will notice reading levels are no longer be reported as specific levels on the report card. Teachers will continue to report student progress to parents, and will be able to provide suggestions for supporting your child at home.


Counselor's Corner
