Pick Up Procedures

We are implementing a standby line procedure for end of day pick up to alleviate the congestion on Upper Bellbrook Rd. We have been doing this for a few weeks now and it is working well! 1. Please pull up as far as you can if you are one of the first people here in the curb lane. 2. Cars that pull in and are past the turn into the parking lot in the curb lane lot will need to pull through the secondary lane in the main drive and line up in the parking lot.

3. Cars pulling in after the standby line has formed need to join the standby line, or let the line pull through for pick up before pulling through to be courteous to the people who have already been waiting in line.

Counselor's Corner

Through classroom counseling and digital literacy class, students have been learning about digital citizenship and cyberbullying. Here are some things families can do to reinforce the things we've learned:

- Limit online socializing- because there is more risk for bullying on sites where kids can openly communicate, avoid open and free chat sites.
- Review the basics of good behavior onlineremind kids that being mena, lying, or telling secrets hurts- both online and offline.
- Remind kids not to share passwords with friends- a common form of cyberbullying is when kids share passwords, log onto another child's account, and pretend to be that person.
- Advise them about how to handle cyberbullying- even though they might be tempted to, advise your child to never retaliate against a cyberbully.

- cycle, block the bully, and tell an adult.
- Make sure your child has someone to talk to, even if it isn't you- it's important that a child can tell a trusted adult if he or she is being bullied online. This isn't tattling. It's standing up for himself or herself.

Coming soon to PE!



BCI students will be participating in speed stacking in physical education classes the week of November 9, 2017. The World Sports Stacking Association (WSSA) is holding their 12th Annual Guinness World Record Day on that Thursday. They are trying to set another world record for "Most People Sport Stacking at Multiple Locations in One Day." The following classes have PE on Thursday, Nov. 9th: Anderson, Bobick, Hof, Cook, and McKinley. All classes will do some speed stacking, but those students who practice speed stacking for at least 30 minutes Nov. 9th, will be counted in the official BCI total and submitted to the WSSA website for verification by Guinness World Records. They could possibly join the 189 BCI students from last year that were part of the group from around the world who set the record at 622,809 in 2016 and the 98 students who helped set the 2015 record of 618,394 stackers. Any students who have their own set of speed stacking cups and/or timer are welcome to bring them in that week on their PE day. Please note that it is not necessary to go out and buy your own. Mrs. Taylor has plenty of speed stacking cups to use in class.
