

- Upcoming events:
  - Jazz Band - will be performing at the March 9th concert
  - Pit Orchestra rehearsals for our spring musical, *Cinderella* have begun!
  - Mid Seasons Choir Concert at BHS - grades 7-12 - Tuesday, March 7, 7pm
  - Mid Seasons HS Band Concert at BHS - Thursday, March 9, 7pm
  - Mid Seasons Middle School Band Concert at BHS - Wednesday, March 15, 7pm
  - WGI Dayton Regional (IPE) - March 18-19
  - Winter Command Performance and Senior Night - Friday, March 24, 7pm BHS Main Gym
  - Sunday, April 30 - Mattress Sale (Main Gym is reserved 8am-6pm)
- Past events:
  - Concert Band Festival
  - Mason Music For All Festival
    - HUGE thanks to everyone who made both of these events successful....drivers, chaperones, snack sellers, equipment haulers, etc. Both of these were fabulous experiences for our concert band kids!
- Winter groups:
  - IPE and Winterguard teams are doing FABULOUS!
  - Congrats to Belles for all their hard work!
  - MS Guard (6th graders) is consistently finishing ahead of teams with 6th/7th/8th graders
  - JV Guard (7th/8th graders) was reclassified (moved up a class) and is finishing ahead of high school teams
  - HS Guard was reclassified to World Class - only 19 guards in the nation who are attending world championships are classified as World Class, out of 196 scholastic guards attending this year (less than 10%!)
  - Bellbrook is the smallest school currently in World Class
  - In 2019 (our most recent season in World Class as a finalist), the average school size was about 2,735 for a finalist group. Median size was 2,730. Smallest was Bellbrook at 893, next smallest was Miamisburg at 1,547, and largest was The Woodlands at 4,331 students (based on approximate 2019 enrollment numbers)
  - At their last competition, IPE improved by over 7 points in one week's time, finishing in first place

- **Lions Club Update:**
  - 3 students spoke at the February 1st Lions Club Meeting, where we made an official ask for help with funding the cost of new uniforms. Lions The students were very well received and the response was very positive! The Lions Club sent me a message earlier today that they will be making a large contribution to our uniform fund!!
