


BHS Drones in School Teams Claim State Championship **Title with Impressive Wins Across Multiple Categories**

BHS LANGUAGE ARTS


9th graders are jumping into the world of Shakespeare with *Romeo and Juliet*. They will analyze "new" language and act out the big fight scenes of the tragic drama with plastic swords and crowns! They will debate over who is responsible for all six deaths in the tragedy, never coming to a full conclusion as all play a vital role.

10th graders are learning to be funny in a humor unit! They are analyzing the different types of humor and practicing different techniques comedians use. They will watch video clips to see humor in action while maintaining appropriate consideration for others inside and outside the classroom walls, being respectful and considerate of all humans in the world.

Honors 10th graders have just finished analyzing what possessions can reveal about humanity. Students crafted their own mini art galleries to display possessions that represent their passions, values, and even dreams for the future. Several galleries were displayed at this year's art show. Now, sophomores are enjoying the art of humor as they explore the classes of comedy and how authors build humor into stories.

English 11-CP students have finished their research papers and are now in the midst of the Modern Unit. They will be focusing on the characteristics of the modern American hero, the newly created narrative techniques, and the common themes related to an emerging mechanized and industrialized society. They will be reading poetry and short stories from such American greats as Robert Frost, Ernest Hemingway, and Ohio native, James Thurber. Students will then more deeply explore the above elements while reading F. Scott Fitzgerald's *The Great Gatsby*.

Students in **English 11/12** are diving into a newer form of media by listening to season one of *Serial*, an award-winning podcast that investigates a real-life crime that took place in Baltimore in 1999. Along with learning about literary nonfiction, students are practicing evaluating evidence, making claims, and supporting their arguments with relevant information.



AP Language students are in the home stretch before the AP exam on May 9. They have learned argument, rhetorical analysis, research, and synthesis skills this year. Students are preparing to write their synthesis research argument papers, a culmination of a school year's worth of preparation.



Journalism took on the work of a newsroom and worked collaboratively to create a series of articles in response to the recent CDC report on teen mental health trends. They interviewed various stakeholders in the school community and researched a series of topics. See their work on **EagleViewNews.com** under the tag CDC Mental Health Report 2023.

Public Speaking students have been very busy this quarter perfecting their speaking skills in a multitude of formats, and they are currently presenting their TED talks. Students had to design a professional title slide, create an outline, and incorporate research into a talk that allowed them to showcase an "idea worth spreading."






Film students recently finished their study of the Western genre. In addition to analyzing Western films, they practiced their collaboration and discussion skills by engaging in a Socratic seminar. They are currently exploring the Gangster genre, looking specifically at the literary, dramatic, and cinematic aspects used in movies like *The Untouchables*, *Road to Perdition*, and *The Godfather*.

Seniors are exploring the world of technical writing; they are focused on writing clear, concise, accurate instructions for tasks that they will teach the class how to complete. They will end the unit creating their own board games that must be fully functional and include instructions that are interesting yet easy to follow.

AP English Literature students are revisiting and honing the crucial skills needed for success on the May 3rd AP exam. They are also beginning Shakespeare's *The Tragedy of Macbeth*, and will be exploring the dimensions of power, corruption, and guilt, among others, as well as answering the essential questions relating to greed, ambition, and a flawed existence.

CLASSROOM AND DEPARTMENTAL NEWS

BHS IS IN BUSINESS

Economics students have researched their topics and are debating some interesting economic issues in class such as online sports betting, cryptocurrencies, minimum wage laws, Universal Basic Income, and others. Class members and guest audience members made up of staff and students from other classes vote to decide who they feel is right and who did the best supporting their position. The debate activity allows students to apply many of the macroeconomic principles and economic indicators learned in class to a real-life topic.



In **Web Design 2**, students are completing their summative project for the course, acting as freelance web designers to create a site for a business scenario. Students have learned how to create responsive websites that are compliant with web standards and accessibility guidelines. Students will publish their sites using GitHub to allow them to showcase their work.



In **Accounting**, students got to talk to Mr. Ben Cutting, CFO of Lithko Contracting. He discussed different career options in the field of Accounting, the difference between an accountant and a CPA, what a degree in accounting will allow you to do in the business field, and his experiences he has had over the years leading into his current position as a Chief Financial Officer. Students were able to interact and ask questions. This was a valuable experience for the students, especially the ones looking to go into accounting as a career.

In **Marketing**, students researched how to increase sales for the Supportive Peers Snack Cart. Students then defended their research and statistics to teachers and administrators in the district.

In **Business Law**, students just completed their mock trial. Students in the class acted as lawyers for the prosecution and the defense. This case was a murder trial where the accused admitted to the crime however claims it was in self defense. Students from study hall (Claire Cutting, Camden Maggart, Brayden Westbeld, and Ella Stillings) acted as the witnesses. Johnny Decszcz was the defendant. Mrs. Tomlin's Psychology class acted as the jury and Officer Black acted as a Sugarcreek Twp. police detective. The jury ultimately found the defendant not guilty.



In **Personal Finance**, students started the stock market game. Each student was given \$10,000 of virtual money to spend in stocks traded on the NYSE and the Nasdaq. Stocks bought or sold mimic gains and losses in real time as if they were really investing in the stock market. Soon your student will be giving some investment advice!

The music department at BHS has continued with a busy but wonderful winter/early spring! The wind ensemble, symphony band, and concert choir gave outstanding performances at their mid-seasons concerts in March, with the bands also traveling to the Music for All Regional Concert Band Festival at Mason High School. The bands played for nationally recognized wind band conductors, and had clinics with their adjudicators; they also had the opportunity to be in the audiences for some amazing performances by other local high schools and community ensembles. The choir and bands are preparing for their final concerts of the year and for graduation. They will all perform on the BHS stage on Tuesday, May 9, when endof-the-year awards will also be presented.



Junior Meetings:

Counselors are starting to meet with Juniors to discuss how to prepare for their Senior year. Counselors will verify that they have requested every course that they need to meet graduation requirements. Check out the class of 2023 graduation requirements here, especially the new requirement for earning seals. All juniors should have completed a grad plan using Transeo. Senior year is a whirlwind of activities and we would encourage you to get started on a few things:

- Take or retake the ACT/SAT this summer
- Search for colleges based on your interests (college search on collegeboard.org). If college isn't in your immediate future, look into possible career fields, apprenticeship programs, or the military.
- Make a college list based on your interests and check the admission criteria.
- Make a list of all the activities you've done in high school including awards, honors, leadership roles, community service
 activities, etc.
- Get out and do some campus visits, if possible, or participate in a virtual visit.
- We will meet again with you in September to talk about the college application process and help you firm up your post-graduation plans.


