## SPRING INTO ACTION: HEALTH AND PE CLASSES DIVE INTO NEW TOPICS AND ACTIVITIES

The Health and PE Department is excited to be back in school after Spring Break!
In the Health classes, Mrs. Rose and Mr. Jenkins are currently covering the topics of Alcohol and Illegal drugs.

Students use health skills in varying contexts and with multiple topics. Skill areas that are incorporated in the Health classes include how to access valid information, use effective communication skills to enhance health, identify healthy decision-making skills, how to advocate for one's health, and adopting behaviors to contribute to positive health and reducing behaviors that are health risks. The Health classes will be getting certified on April 29 for Adult CPR/AED!

## PE classes:



Mind and Body Wellness class participates daily in Yoga/Meditation. The Weightlifting classes continue to complete daily workouts in the weightroom. PE 2 just wrapped up the Volleyball unit and is now playing Lacrosse.

The PE classes will soon be participating in the Fitnessgram Fitness testing (for flexibility, muscular strength \& endurance, and cardiovascular endurance) as they continue completing the Ohio Physical Education Standard Assessments.

Leadership continues to develop effective leadership traits. The class learns strategies, traits, habits, routines, and commonalities from highly effective leaders through readings, group activities/discussions, and presentations.

## COMPUTER 5CIENCE CLA5SE5 GEAR UP FOR AP EXAMS AND FNAL PROJECTS



The end of the year is approaching so the Computer Science classes are wrapping up new information and are beginning to prepare for AP Exams and Final Projects. The Intro to Java Programming classes will be beginning their final unit (Classes and Objects). This unit includes projects that involve programming a virtual "turtle" object that can draw images to the screen. The Game Development class is currently using Python to edit pictures taken in front of a green screen. Both of these classes will end the semester with a capstone-style project that will count as a significant part of their final exam.

The AP Computer Science Principles class recently submitted their "Create Performance Task" projects to the AP Portfolio site. These projects will count as $30 \%$ of their AP Exam grades. The class is currently completing their final unit (Data Analytics) and will soon begin a major Data Analysis project. The AP

Computer Science A class completed a unit on recursive algorithms before Spring Break and has most recently been exploring the topic of inheritance between super and sub classes. Both AP classes are beginning to prepare for AP Exams which will take place during the 1st and 2nd weeks of May.

The Advanced Game Development group recently completed a project that required them to "modernize" a vintage arcade game from the 1980s. They produced outstanding 3D versions of Frogger and Dig Dug. They have started their final project (a 2D puzzle-themed game) which is scheduled to be presented to a mystery panel during Senior Exams.

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## COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

Any student interested in doing a College Credit Plus class next year at BHS or a college should read through the CCP information meeting slides. Details were shared about eligibility rules, application deadlines, and required testing and can be found on our webpage at http://www.sugarcreek.k12.oh.us/CollegeCreditPlus.aspx. Any student interested in participating in the college credit plus program during the $24-25$ school year must complete the intent to participate form by April 1st. A password is required to complete the form and can be found at the end of the slide presentation. If you are a returning CCP student for the same college, you only need to complete the intent to participate form.

- Students taking French $3 / 4$ for college credit next fall must complete the WSU CCP application by May 1st at http://www.wright.edu/college-credit-plus/enrollment-process. You must tell Mrs. Scohy once you've completed the application so she can send your transcript.
- Students taking Supply Chain Management or Spanish 3/4 for college credit next fall must complete the Sinclair CCP application by May 1st at https://engagecms-100933.campusnexus.cloud/custom-portal/userprofile/login.
- Students planning to take a course at a college campus or online must complete a college CCP application by the required deadline. Most schools have an application deadline of May 1st however you want to do the application as soon as possible so you can schedule your fall classes when the registration window opens in April.
