Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Schools to Adopt ParentSquare in 2025-26

Exciting news for Bellbrook-Sugarcreek families! Starting in the 2025-26 school year, the district will transition to ParentSquare as its primary communication platform, replacing the Remind app.

ParentSquare will streamline communication between the district, schools, teachers, and families. Parents will be able to receive important alerts, messages, and updates, as well as access features like photo sharing from teachers, online forms, permission slips, and parent-teacher conference sign-ups. Plus, ParentSquare offers real-time language translation and both one-on-one and group messaging to keep everyone connected.

Following its acquisition of Remind last year, ParentSquare has become the most widely used school communication platform in the U.S., now serving over 38,000 districts. Locally, schools like Beavercreek, Centerville, Greeneview, and Yellow Springs are already using it with great success.

THE R-FACTOR: A MINDSET FOR SUCCESS

At Bellbrook High School, we believe that success isn't just about talent or intelligence—it's also about mindset. That's why we're introducing the R-Factor, a powerful approach to handling life's challenges. Understanding and applying the R-Factor can lead to better decisions, stronger relationships, and greater success.

What Is the R-Factor?

The R-Factor is based on a simple but powerful equation:

$E + R = O$ (Event + Response = Outcome)

We can't always control the events in life—unexpected setbacks, conflicts, or challenges—but we can control our response, which determines the outcome. By choosing our responses wisely, we can turn challenges into opportunities.

The 6 R-Factor Disciplines

To help put the R-Factor into action, we focus on six key disciplines:

- 2 **Get Your Mind Right** – Your mindset shapes your actions. Focus on positive, productive thoughts instead of dwelling on frustration or negativity.
- 3 **Step Up** – Take responsibility for your actions and choices. Do what needs to be done, even when it's difficult.
- 4 **Adjust & Adapt** – Life is full of unexpected challenges. Be flexible and willing to adjust your approach instead of getting stuck in frustration.
- 5 **Make a Difference** – Your choices impact others. Whether at school, at home, or in the community, be intentional about making a positive impact.
- 6 **Build Skill** – The R-Factor is like a muscle—the more you practice, the stronger you become. Focus on developing these habits daily.

Why the R-Factor Matters

By embracing the R-Factor, we can create a culture of responsibility, resilience, and respect—at school and at home. This approach not only helps students succeed academically and socially, but also prepares them for life beyond high school. When students consistently apply these principles, they develop the skills needed to navigate college, careers, and personal relationships with confidence and maturity.

Students just wrapped up participating in the international Music Mania Tournaments for Spanish and French. The winning songs were "Candela" (Spanish) and "Minimum Ça" (French). Students have learned so much language and culture on various themes this year including: greetings, sports and leisure, weather, holidays, clothing, environment, media, family, school, food, housing, places around town, daily routine, health and technology. We are currently covering the following topics:

Spanish 1 is going on virtual tours of various Spanish-speaking countries, comparing the cost of living in Bellbrook to cities from the tours, and learning about biodiversity in Costa Rica.

French 1 started a new unit that focuses where we do our activities and pastimes. They will create a Where's Waldo page using places and activities important to them and talk about where to go to find him.

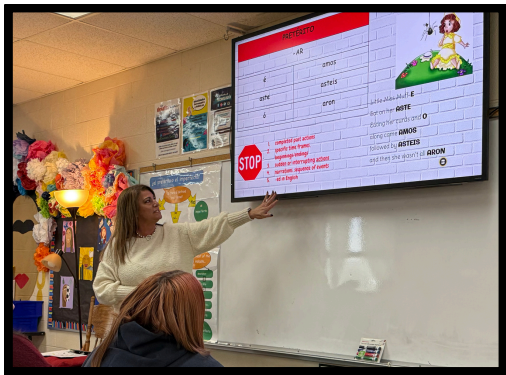

Wellness, Workouts, and Life Skills in Full Swing

The Health and PE Department is happy to be back after Spring Break and is diving right into new lessons and activities!

In Health classes, Mrs. Rose and Mr. Jenkins are currently teaching about the dangers of alcohol and illegal drugs. Students are also learning important life skills, like how to find reliable health information, make healthy decisions, communicate clearly, stand up for their own health, and build habits that support a healthy lifestyle while avoiding risky behaviors.

On May 7 & 8, **Health** students will be earning their Adult CPR/AED certification!

In PE classes:

- The **Mind and Body Wellness** class practices yoga and meditation every day to improve focus and relaxation.
- **Weightlifting** students are working hard with daily workouts in the weight room.
- **PE 2** just finished a fun Soccer unit and is now learning how to play Lacrosse.
- **Speed and Agility** students are continuing daily exercises to build speed, strength, and flexibility.

All **PE students** are wrapping up their Fitnessgram Fitness Testing, which includes flexibility, strength, endurance, and heart health, as part of the Ohio Physical Education Standards.



Bellbrook High School Earns Purple Star Designation for Commitment to Military Families



Supporting Military Families

Bellbrook High School has once again been honored with the Purple Star designation by the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce, recognizing its outstanding commitment to supporting students and families connected to the U.S. military.

The Purple Star Award is presented to schools that demonstrate a significant commitment to serving military-connected students and families. To qualify, schools must fulfill several criteria, including appointing a dedicated staff liaison for military families, providing professional development for staff on the unique challenges faced by military-connected students, and maintaining a dedicated webpage with resources for military families. Additionally, schools must complete at least one optional activity, such as hosting military recognition events or implementing peer-to-peer transition programs, to further support these students.

Bellbrook High School's achievement is part of a district-wide commitment, as all schools within the Bellbrook-Sugarcreek School District, including Bellbrook Middle School, Bell Creek Intermediate, and Stephen Bell Elementary, have received the Purple Star designation. This collective recognition underscores the district's dedication to creating a supportive environment for military families.

The designation remains valid for three years, after which schools must reapply to maintain their status. Bellbrook High School's continued efforts reflect its unwavering support for military-connected students, ensuring they receive the necessary resources and understanding to thrive academically and socially.

Family and Consumer Sciences: Building Life Skills for the Future

We are thrilled to share the incredible experiences happening in our Family and Consumer Sciences classes this semester, where students are gaining valuable life skills across several key areas.

Global Foods

Our students have embarked on an exciting culinary journey, exploring the flavors and traditions of international cuisines. They've prepared a variety of global dishes, including Croque Monsieur from France, Swedish Meatballs, Spanish Churros, Japanese Sushi, Naan Bread, and Brazilian Brigadeiros. A memorable highlight was a field trip to Jungle Jim's International Market, where students gained hands-on knowledge about global food cultures and ingredients.

Nutrition and Wellness

In our Nutrition and Wellness class, students have been diving into healthy eating and nutrition. They've been busy crafting nutritious recipes like Fruit Salsa, Protein Bites, Baked Buffalo Chicken Fingers, and Whole Grain Chocolate Muffins. Students are also mastering important skills such as ingredient substitution to create healthier meals and designing menus that align with the American Dietary Guidelines.

Personal Wellness

Our Personal Wellness curriculum takes a holistic approach to student growth. Students have engaged in personality assessments, learning both short- and long-term goal-setting strategies. They've explored career and college preparation, researching scholarships and financial aid options, and exploring future career paths. The class also focuses on relationship-building skills, including communication strategies, conflict resolution techniques, and an introduction to the 5 Love Languages. Students have also gained essential knowledge in personal finance, stress management, and the critical importance of sleep for overall well-being.

These courses are shaping well-rounded students with skills that will benefit them for a lifetime!

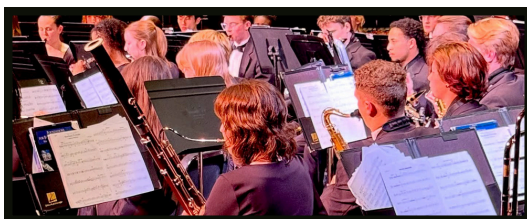


From Festival to Finals: A Spring of Musical Excellence

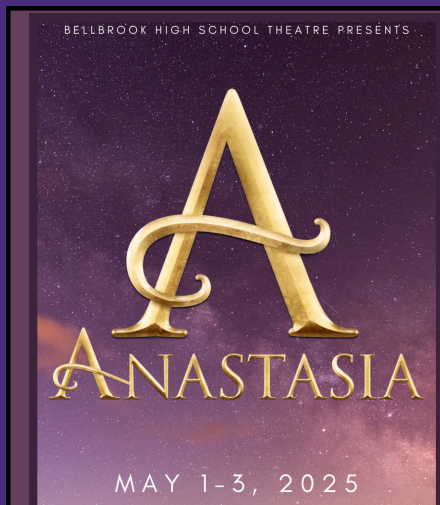

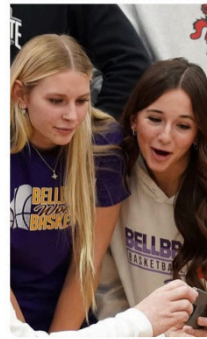
