## HIGH SCHOOL HEADLINES

### FOUR BHS SENIORS SHINE AS FINALISTS IN 2024 NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Bellbrook High School is pleased to announce that seniors Adam Beane, Maya Brink, Lincoln Warren, and Lorelai Wolverton have been named Finalists in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program. These talented students will now compete for 7,140 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$31 million.

The National Merit Scholarship Program's selection process is known for its intense competition and rigorous standards. Out of more than 1.5 million juniors who participated in the Preliminary PSAT/NMSQT exam across 22,000 high schools nationwide, these students emerged as the cream of the crop. As Semifinalists, they represent less than 1% of all high school seniors in the country, showcasing their exceptional academic prowess.

The National Merit Scholarship winners will be announced in four nationwide news releases that are scheduled to take place later this spring. Bellbrook High School takes immense pride in acknowledging and celebrating the impressive achievements of these students.

## EXCELLENCE IS NOT ACHIEVED BY ACCIDENT

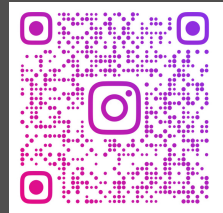

## From Global Tastes to Personal Goals: Family and Consumer Science Program Enriches Lives



Welcome to the dynamic world of Family and Consumer Science, where students are not just mastering the art of culinary creations but also navigating the intricacies of personal and nutritional well-being. In Global Foods, our students embark on a global gastronomic journey, whipping up dishes that reflect the rich tapestry of world cultures. From shepherd's pie to Swedish meatballs, each creation becomes a passport to understanding diverse culinary traditions. Meanwhile, in Nutrition and Wellness, students delve into the science of nourishment, experimenting with recipes that emphasize both health and flavor. Culinary Fundamentals takes a hands-on approach, honing knife skills and venturing into the realm of baking. Lastly, Personal Wellness equips students with life skills, from goal-setting and career exploration to understanding the dynamics of family, communication, and relationships. Join us as we blend the art and science of homemaking, fostering a holistic approach to education that extends far beyond the kitchen. Please take a moment to read a little more about what our students are currently working on:

**Global Foods:** Students in Global Foods are busy learning about different cultures. Students have made many dishes, including shepherd's pie, scones, croque monsieur, crepes, swedish meatballs, and apple strudel. Students are looking forward to their field trip to Jungle Jim's in March.

**Nutrition and Wellness:** Classes have been busy learning about all the different types of nutrients their body needs. Students have made several healthy dishes including, fruit salsa, protein bites, baked buffalo chicken fingers and whole grain chocolate muffins. They are currently discussing healthy meal plans and The Dietary Guidelines.



**Culinary Fundamentals:** Students have learned basic knife skills. They practiced their knife skills in the lab by making several different knife cuts and creating a cajun pasta. Students are working on the baking unit where they have made several dishes including homemade pancakes, yeast bread, biscuits and homemade cookies. They are looking forward to designing their homemade cakes and practicing cake decorating.



**Personal Wellness:** Students in Personal Wellness have participated in a personality test and set short term and long term goals for themselves. They have researched colleges and careers and have discussed scholarships, grants and loans. Students are now discussing the importance of family, communication and conflict resolution. Our next unit will be on communication and relationships. We will look at all aspects of relationships and how to maintain positive relationships throughout their life and they will learn about the 5 love languages.

# FROM BLOOD DRIVES TO GOD BLESS AMERICA: BHS CADETS EXCEL IN DIVERSE ACTIVITIES

The Cadets of OH-20061 at Bellbrook High School have truly demonstrated their commitment to community service and excellence throughout the year. Their remarkable efforts have resulted in an impressive accumulation of over 1191 community service hours, showcasing their dedication to making a positive impact on the community.

During the annual canned food drive last fall, the cadets exhibited their generosity by collecting an outstanding total of 9,626 cans and \$154. This substantial donation was directed towards the Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Community Support Center, reinforcing their commitment to addressing local needs. In March, the cadets are poised to contribute to the Boy Scouts' food drive, aiming to help reach the ambitious goal of collecting 11,000 non-perishable food items.

Their involvement in the community extends beyond philanthropy. The Color Guard has been a prominent participant at home football and basketball games, local events, and even collaborated with a local VFW troop at a soccer game. They successfully organized a blood drive on February 2nd, contributing 44 units of blood to the local area.

Field trips have added educational and adventurous dimensions to their experiences. Cadets participated in an Air Camp event at the Greene County Airport, engaged in indoor skydiving at iFly, and planned a visit to the Air Force Museum. These experiences not only broaden their horizons but also foster camaraderie among the cadets.

Looking ahead, the cadets are gearing up for exciting events, including a Combat Dining-In in March, featuring an obstacle course and a special dance performance from senior leadership. The commitment to community service will persist with upcoming activities like the Raiders competition, a 14-mile hike, and an end-of-year awards ceremony.

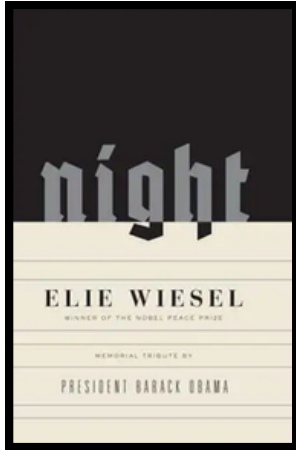

## BHS English Language Arts Classes Shape Critical Thinkers and Skilled Communicators

At BHS, English Language Arts students are delving into diverse units, each designed to foster growth, reflection, and skill development. Let's take a closer look at some of the engaging literary and thematic pursuits underway in classes, as well as the various enriching activities in film studies, journalism, and public speaking.



**Freshmen** are delving into self-exploration through the creation of "This I Believe" essays. This reflective writing follows an intense unit on Holocaust literature, centered around Elie Wiesel's memoir, *Night*.

**Ms. Colarusso's English 10** students are immersed in a food-themed unit. They are crafting personal odes and memoirs, sharing memories and experiences related to food. Additionally, they are studying informational texts that shed light on the origins of our food and the challenges within the food industry.

**Mrs. B-H's 10CP** students are concluding their "All that Glitters" unit. Their focus has been on exploring materialism through various informational and literary texts. Essential discussions revolve around the question: What insights do our possessions offer about us?

**Ms. Lewis's Honors 10** students are progressing through the "Outsiders and Outcasts" unit, anchored by *The Scarlet Letter* as the class novel. After completing argumentative research essays and small group debates, they are now refining punctuation and grammatical skills.

Meanwhile, Mrs. B-H's **11th-grade** English students are gearing up for *The Great Gatsby*. The upcoming focus includes analyzing themes and symbols and sharpening comparison skills through diverse versions of the text.

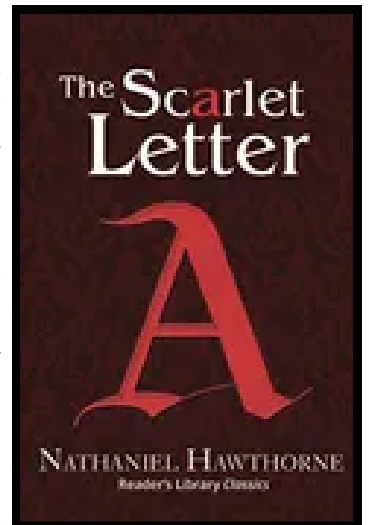
In Mrs. Klepac's **11th grade CP** class, students are honing their identification of poetic literary devices and delving into their significance within an analysis unit. Alongside, they're engaged in grammar and punctuation lessons, preparing for the upcoming ACT test on February 27th.

**CP12** students are in the midst of True Crime. They've explored local mysteries, analyzed an award winning true crime podcast, and argued the ethics behind true crime as a form of entertainment. They will finish the unit with a classic pairing of Shakespeare's *Macbeth*.

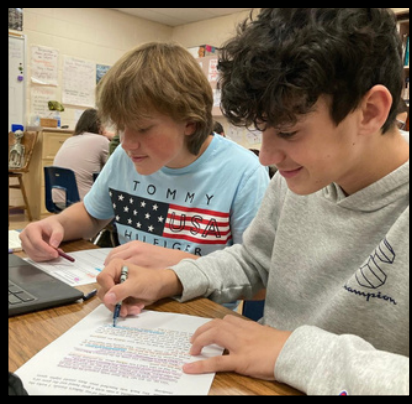
**AP Lang** students have seen huge growth over the first semester in their study of creating arguments and now they are heading into rhetorical analysis. January marks the second half of their year-long synthesis research project with more exploration of their self-selected topics.

**AP Lit** students continue to grasp literary elements and techniques in prose and poetry. Timed essays are a key practice, preparing them thoroughly for the upcoming AP Exam in May.

**Yearbook** students are actively completing assignments for this year's publication, alongside weekly writing tasks and **Film** students are dissecting movies on three levels—literary, dramatic, and cinematic. Featured films include "Back to the Future," "The Shawshank Redemption," and "Jaws."

In **Public Speaking**, students began the semester with diverse speeches and activities to build confidence. They are now refining stage and speaking techniques, such as proxemics and kinesics, and preparing for their upcoming Life Events speeches.

Students are not merely absorbing information but actively engaging with literature, honing critical thinking skills, and delving into the intricacies of communication through various mediums. The journey provides students with opportunities for self-expression, analytical exploration, and skill development that extend beyond the traditional classroom setting. 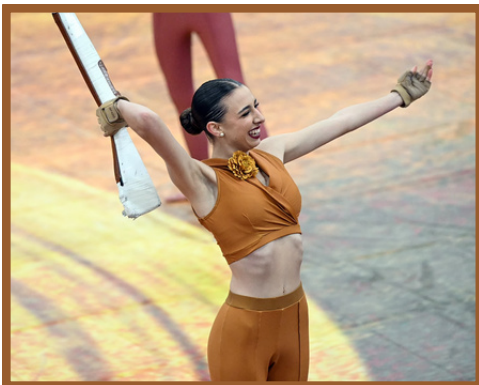
# BHS MUSIC DEPARTMENT STRIKES THE RIGHT CHORD WITH WINTER ACTIVITIES

### **Testing Day: Feb 27th:**

**SENIORS** will participate in Job Shadow or Community Service day on Feb 27th in order to accommodate ACT testing for juniors. Seniors are encouraged to coordinate their own job shadow or community service location.

State-funded ACT testing for **JUNIORS** will take place on Feb 27th. Students do not need to register. A mandatory pre-administration session will be held during homeroom the week prior to testing, on Feb 21st. On testing day, students will arrive at BHS no later than 8:05am. Room locations will be shared closer to the testing date. Testing will take 3.5 hours and students will be released at approximately noon after all tests have been collected. GCCC students will take the ACT at the GCCC.

**SOPHOMORES** will have a scheduling presentation, complete a grad plan, and have a guest speaker and college panel.

**FRESHMAN** will complete career assessments, have a scheduling presentation, complete a grad plan, and listen to the guest speaker.
