On Friday, January 24th, Bellbrook High School held its first-ever invitation-only Career Fair, giving students a special opportunity to explore different career paths after graduation. Whether they were considering college, trade programs, or jumping straight into the workforce, students connected with professionals and learned about exciting job opportunities. The event took place in the Auxiliary Gym during second period and featured local businesses, trade programs, and healthcare representatives. These industry professionals shared valuable insights, helping students discover careers they might not have considered before.

We are proud to share that seniors Oliver Alban and Connor Payne have been named Finalists in the 2025 National Merit Scholarship Program! This is an incredible achievement, and they will now compete for 6,870 scholarships worth over \$31 million.

The National Merit Scholarship Program is highly competitive, with more than 1.5 million juniors from 22,000 high schools across the country entering through the PSAT/NMSQT exam. Being named Finalists means Oliver and Connor are among the top 1% of high school seniors nationwide, a true testament to their hard work and academic excellence.

Winners of the National Merit Scholarships will be announced in four news releases later this spring. We are incredibly proud of Oliver and Connor and wish them the best as they move forward in this prestigious competition!


Pep band has been bringing the energy to home basketball games, and jazz band is preparing for their first performance on Thursday, March 6 at the Mid-Season High School Bands concert.

<u>Scheduling Night:</u> February 13th: <u>4:30 pm - 6:30</u> pm BHS Academic Departments will man tables in the lobby outside the gym, <u>5:30 pm</u> - Scheduling Q&A session (8th grade parents highly encouraged to attend) in the auditorium, <u>6:30 pm</u> - mandatory CCP meeting in the auditorium. All presentations will be posted on our <u>website</u> and posted in the google classrooms for students. All students will be given a course selection form during the classroom meeting that must be signed by a parent and turned back in to homeroom teachers no later than March 20th.

<u>ACT Test Changes for 2025.</u> Beginning in April 2025, students who choose to take the ACT online will see an updated format that's shorter and lets you choose whether to include the science section, allowing for greater flexibility while maintaining the accuracy and reliability colleges rely on. These changes will also apply to the paper-pencil test starting in September 2025. The Composite score will now focus on English, math, and reading, while science scores will be reported separately for those who take it. These updates ensure colleges can continue making informed admission and scholarship decisions, making your results even more relevant as students take the next steps toward higher education.
