
ORDER YOUR 23-24 YEARBOOK

WORLD LANGUAGES BIENVENUE AND BIENVENIDOS!

The World Language Department is excited to be back to work at BHS welcoming our new and returning students, as well as a new face to the department, Kristen Krumheuer. While our upper level students are looking forward to visiting WSU for both their Spanish and French Immersion days, the rest of our language students are making great progress towards their language acquisition. They are learning about introductions, Spanish and French speaking countries, food culture, family culture, environmental issues, technology, daily routines, relationships, and the cultural value of ideas.

Spanish and French 1 are diving into the basics of the language and beginning to learn how to greet one another, count, and learn where Spanish and French are spoken.

Spanish 2 is learning how to talk about families and the cultural importance of celebrations like the quince.

French 2 is exploring breakfast culture in French speaking countries while learning how to talk about their food preferences.

Spanish 3 has just completed a unit where they acquired the ability to discuss their daily routines and compare them to those of typical Spanish-speaking teenagers.

In **French 3**, students are currently delving into the traditional mealtime customs and shopping habits of the French culture.

Meanwhile, **Spanish 4** students are immersed in exploring personal relationships, with a special focus on examining the relationships of Latinos living in the United States.

In **French 4**, students are engaged in discussions about environmental issues and are learning about endangered species. They will soon be tasked with developing and presenting solutions to help save these endangered creatures.

As for **Spanish 5**, students are diving into the concept of the value of ideas and their influence on social justice. They are also honing their skills in historical narration.

In contrast, **French 5** students are delving the world of technology, dissecting how social media and technological advancements impact daily life.

BUILDING THE FUTURE: ENGINEERING STUDENTS EXCEL IN DESIGN ENDEAVORS

BHS Engineering students have been hard at work on some fascinating projects. Here's what they've been up to:



Introduction to Engineering Design: Creative Carnival Fun

First-year engineering students have just finished their initial design project. They learned about the design process and sketching techniques while creating a carnival game board and a bean bag launcher. It was a hands-on experience that helped them understand real-world engineering.



Students in Principles of Engineering completed a smaller design project where they reviewed the engineering design process. They designed, built, and tested a prototype shoe for a specific client. This practical experience will serve them well in their future studies.



Digital Electronics: From Theory to Practice

Digital Electronics students have been diving into electronic components. They started with theory, learning about the basics of electronics and creating circuits on computers. Soon, they'll take what they've learned and build physical circuits. The ultimate challenge? Soldering their own working circuit boards, putting their knowledge into action.

Engineering Design and Development: Cultivating Innovation

In the Engineering Design and Development program, students are busy brainstorming ideas for their final projects. They began with around 100 ideas and are now narrowing them down through discussions with peers, research, and input from professionals. It's an exciting process that prepares them to tackle real-world problems.

BELLBROOK SCHOOL DISTRICT STANDS ALONE AS DAYTON AREA'S SOLE FIVE-STAR PERFORMER IN OHIO'S NEW EDUCATION RATINGS

On Thursday, the Ohio Department of Education unveiled the latest scores, marking a significant update to its star-based rating system for the year. This year's revamped system now incorporates comprehensive ratings, where achieving a minimum of three stars indicates that a district is in compliance with state standards.

The students and staff of Bellbrook High School secured a five-star rating, making it one of fewer than 100 high schools in the state to attain such a distinction. Additionally, Bellbrook Sugarcreek Schools has emerged as one of only eight school districts in the state to earn five stars across all categories as a district. Schools and districts are assessed across five performance components that include: Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Graduation, and Early Literacy. Bellbrook is the only district in the greater Dayton area to attain this recognition.

Ticket Info for the 2023-24 School Year

- Tickets and passes will be the same price as last school year, except for the student all-sports pass.
- There are several pass options but all passes must be purchased on our <u>ticketing website</u>. The student all-sports pass (<u>online</u>) is now only \$50! Good for ALL games at the MS & HS.
- The new state budget requires all schools to accept cash starting in October.
- We will take cash at all games/all year.
- Our ticking partner has increased their convenience fees for tickets sold at the gate.
- There is now a price for cash and a higher price for credit cards. Ticket prices are outlined here.
- No student or senior discounts for individual game tickets. Senior residents (60 & older) of Bellbrook & Sugarcreek can already get a free pass that gets them into all school events, which is obtained from the Athletic Department. 

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

What is it?

The National Honor Society (NHS) is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding high school students. More than just an honor roll, NHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, and character. It is important to understand that chapter membership not only recognizes students for their past accomplishments but challenges them to develop further through active involvement in school activities and community service.



Who can participate?

Sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are enrolled as full-time students at Bellbrook High School are eligible for consideration as members. In order to be academically eligible, a student must have an unweighted, cumulative high school grade point average of at least 3.51. In order to be eligible, the student must have attended Bellbrook High School for a minimum of one semester (military exceptions can be made). Selection takes into account a candidate's grade point average, involvement in school and community activities, leadership positions held, and evaluations from the entire high school faculty. School disciplinary records are checked for a candidate's entire high school career. Again, selection for membership in the National Honor Society is an award from the faculty and is similar to any other scholarship or award in that it is a privilege and not a right of any student.

When does it take place?

NHS holds meetings, events, and community service drives throughout the school year.

Who can participate?


Qualified juniors and seniors who show an interest in positively mentoring underclass peers.

What is it?




JAZZ BAND
