BHS Celebrates Highest AP Scores in School History



In May 2024, 191 students from Bellbrook High School took 390 AP exams and achieved record-breaking success. An impressive 93% of students scored a 3, 4, or 5, which is the highest percentage in school history. This year also saw the most students earning 4's and 5's on their exams, showing their hard work and determination.

Seventy students received AP Scholar Awards for their excellent performance, with 33 of them earning the special title of AP Scholar with Distinction. These top students averaged an outstanding score of 4.22 across all their exams.

The achievements of these students reflect their commitment to academic excellence and their ability to perform at the highest level in challenging subjects. The school community is incredibly proud of their hard work and dedication, which has led to such remarkable results. Congratulations to all the students who participated in AP exams this year—you have made history with your incredible achievements!


CADETS DIVE INTO SERVICE: AFJROTC Hits the Ground Running

AFJROTC welcomed 30 new cadets into our program and welcomed back 41 cadets. These 71 cadets hit the ground round running this year and dove right into community service events accumulating over 250 service hours already! Many volunteered over the summer for camps and church events; they also helped out at Germanfest in downtown Dayton, started the recycling program at BHS, helped the Lion's Club tear down after the festival and our Color Guard led the Lion's Club parade. We are looking forward to continuing to support our home football games by presenting the colors and our community through our Food Drive that will run from October through December. Dates for our food drive will be set soon and we'll advertise which neighborhood we'll be going to each week through our website and through the Bellbrook Sugarcreek Community Support Center. Cadets are also

planning orienteering events, putting together a Raiders Physical Fitness Competition team and many other fun activities this semester and throughout the year. We will have a few fundraisers this year through restaurant Dine-to-Donate and spirit wear sales; these will be posted on our website if you'd like to support - all funds go to support cadet activities!

FROM FUNDAMENTALS TO ADVANCED TOPICS: COMPUTER SCIENCE CLASSES IN FULL SWING

The Computer Science classes are in full swing a few weeks into the school year. AP Computer Science A is finishing up a review of fundamental concepts to prepare for an in-depth study of Object-Oriented Programming in Java. AP Computer Science Principles is exploring how various types of data, such as text and images, are converted into binary numbers. Next, students will learn about the transmission of binary data over networks. The Intro to Computer Science Principles classes are examining the impact of technology on society and industry, with an upcoming project to create a History of Computing Technology timeline that spans from the abacus to modern advancements. Meanwhile, the Game Development and Multimedia Programming class is starting with basic game design using Scratch, and will soon transition to a 3D environment with the Alice programming language.





MUSIC DEPARTMENT NOTES



The Music Department has had a great start to the school year, with around 160 students participating in some facet of our program. The Wind Ensemble and Symphony Band are hard at work preparing for their October Spooktacular concert, which will feature close to 300 students in 7th through 12th grades. The concert will be in the main gym at BHS on October 15 at 7pm. The high school choir will present their fall concert on Wednesday, October 9 at BHS at 7pm. They will share the concert with the 7th and 8th grade choir.

The Marching Eagles have been hard at work since June preparing for their 2024 competitive season. They have been out to support the team at their games and Meet the Team night, as well as representing BHS Music on the teachers' first day and at the Bellbrook Lions Club festival. This year's show is entitled "Edward" and is loosely based on the Edward Scissorhands story. Bellbrook High School is happy to welcome Mr. Jacob Page as our new marching band director! Mr. Page also teaches band classes at both the middle school and high school, and comes to us from Colerain High School. Welcome, Mr. Page!

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

What is it:

The National Honor Society (NHS) is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding high school students. More than just an honor roll, NHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, and character. It is important to understand that chapter membership not only recognizes students for their past accomplishments but challenges them to develop further through active involvement in school activities and community service.



Who can participate?

Sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are enrolled as full-time students at Bellbrook High School are eligible for consideration as members. In order to be academically eligible, a student must have an unweighted, cumulative high school grade point average of at least 3.51. In order to be eligible, the student must have attended Bellbrook High School for a minimum of one semester (military exceptions can be made). Selection takes into account a candidate's grade point average, involvement in school and community activities, leadership positions held, and evaluations from the entire high school faculty. School disciplinary records are checked for a candidate's entire high school career. Again, selection for membership in the National Honor Society is an award from the faculty and is similar to any other scholarship or award in that it is a privilege and not a right of any student.

NHS holds meetings, events, and community service drives throughout the school year.

A mentorship program of juniors and seniors who help freshmen and other students new to Bellbrook High School orient to the building and school community.


Who can participate?




MARCHING BAND
