CLASSROOM AND DEPARTMENTAL NEWS

SOCIAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Government: Students are learning about the U.S. Constitution and the establishment of the government of the United States and how it applies today.

AP Government: Students are learning the foundations of American democracy and analyzing founding documents such as the Federalist Papers and the Antifederalist Papers.

American Studies: Students are learning about industrialization and westward expansion during the second half of the nineteenth century.

AP U.S. History: Students are analyzing the U.S. Constitution and the Federalist Papers to better understand the founding fathers and our system of government.



World Studies: Students are preparing to learn about Enlightenment ideas and thinkers, their impact on western civilization and the American system of government.

Global Issues: Students are closely following the 2020 presidential election and will analyze the candidates, parties, speeches, and debates.

Rock & Roll in American History: Students have been learning about the civil rights movement, the Cold War and 1950s America through the music and icons of rock and roll. Next up: the 1960s and the continued pursuit for civil rights and the Vietnam War.

Sociology: Students are learning about the foundations of sociology and sociological research.

The **PSAT** test will be administered on the morning of Oct 14th at Bellbrook High School. This test can qualify 11th-grade students for the National Merit Scholarship Program. Due to COVID we only have space to offer this to 10th and 11th graders this year. Sign-up now using this Google form. Cost is \$17. Students can bring cash or check to Mrs. Ralston in the counseling office. Deadline to register is Sep 15th. Visit https:// collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt-psat-10 for more information about the PSAT/NMSQT.

<u>Practice ACT</u>, sponsored by Huntington Learning Center, will be offered at BHS on Oct. 3rd. Cost is \$20. Sign-up now using this Google Form. Students can bring cash or check to Mrs. Ralston in the counseling office. This is a full length practice test. Students will attend a review session the following week with a 10-page breakdown of scores indicating strengths and areas to improve as well as test taking tips. Deadline to register is Sep 25th.

*Girls Varsity Soccer will host Brookville on Thurs Sept 10th; game time is 7:15pm.


*Varsity Volleyball will host Brookville at home Thurs, Sept 10th; game time is 6:30pm.
