LEVY INFORMATION

IMPORTANT SCHOOL LEVY ON NOVEMBER 2020 BALLOT

The Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Board of Education voted to put a 5.7-mill continuing operating levy on the November 3, 2020 ballot. The passage of this operating levy will provide a critical lifeline to the district to help fund the district's day-to-day operations, such as staffing, utilities, transportation and supplies. The financial situation of Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Schools continues to be an extremely critical issue facing our school district. Without additional funding, we simply cannot continue to make reductions without seriously impacting the quality of our students' educational experience and unfortunately, that is where we are right now. Since 2018, and following the failure of the May 2019 and March 2020 ballot issues, the Bellbrook-Sugarcreek School District Board of Education has implemented four phases of reductions that total over \$4.8 million and the reduction of over 11% of our staff. Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Schools

Operating Levy on the November 3 Ballot



The district is on the ballot for a 5.7 mill operating levy.
The levy will raise \$3.3 million per year.

An operating levy helps fund the day-to-day operations, such as staffing, utilities, transportation, maintenance, and supplies. If passed, the levy would cost the district taxpayers \$199.50/year or \$16.63/month per \$100,000 appraised market value.

- The district has saved \$4.8 million in four phases of budget reductions from 2018 through 2022.
- Program Cuts for 2020-21:
 - ~ K-5 STEM, K-6 Art, World Languages at BMS, S.T.E.P. Gifted program at BCI
 - ~ BHS busing eliminated, reduced to the 2-mile state minimum at BCI & BMS
 - ~ Increased sports participation fees for BMS to \$200 and BHS to \$300
- ~ 85 sports, clubs, advisors, or department chair positions (examples includeclass advisors for 9th, 10th, 12th grades, Math Pentathalon at BCI & BMS, BHS pep band, all staff department chair positions, BMS play, freshman boys basketball, JV lacrosse teams, and BHS academic team)
- Teacher and support staff unions, as well as all administrators, are on a complete pay FREEZE, including longevity and step increases, for 2020-2021.
- All staff took a reduction in insurance benefits starting in 2019-20.
- # 11% REDUCTION (33) in teaching/staff positions since 2018.
- Per pupil spending is \$530 LESS than similar districts and \$1,121.18 LESS than State Avg.**
- The district has 17 LESS teachers compared to peer districts.*
- The district has 7 LESS administrators than similar districts and state average.**
- School teachers and staff are paid LESS over their careers compared to local peer districts.*
- # 44% of the district buses NEED TO BE REPLACED (12 years or older or over 150,000 miles).*
- 90% of student and staff computers are in their 4th year of life or older.
- Facilities expenditures per square foot is 13.5% LESS than peer districts.*
- Resident tax effort (community's tax burden compared to other districts) is BELOW the state average and local peer average.*
- Due to the COVID-19 state budget cuts, the district has an additional net LOSS of state revenue of approximately \$1,013,000 from May 2020 through June 2021.

What if the November Levy Passes?

It will provide much needed financial stability for years to come. The Board has agreed to reinstate the following Phase IV reductions during the 2020-21 school year: K-5 STEM & Art, 85 supplementals for sports/clubs/advisors, 2 full-time librarians, BHS busing as soon as we have enough trained drivers, and 6th grade Art for the 2021-2022 school year.

What if the November Levy Does Not Pass?

All of the \$4.8 million in reductions will stay in place and the future of our high-caliber programs and providing a well-rounded student experience will be in serious jeopardy as reducing costs and making reductions will play an increasingly bigger role in decision-making. These cuts and reductions will move our district closer and closer to state minimums regarding electives, programs, class sizes, and busing.

CLASSROOM AND DEPARTMENTAL NEWS

HEALTH

HEALTH and PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The Health and PE Department is excited to be back in school this

fall! Mrs. Rose and Mr. Jenkins are currently covering the topics of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Illegal drugs in health class. Students use health skills in varying contexts and with multiple topics. Skill areas that are incorporated in the Health classes include how to access valid information, use effective communication skills to enhance health, identify healthy decision-making skills, how to advocate for one's health, and adopting behaviors that contribute to positive health and reducing behaviors that are health risks.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Students at BHS have a number of new PE courses to choose from this year. Mind and Body Wellness classes participate daily in either Yoga/ Meditation or Pilates. Dance class is currently working on choreography for a lyrical routine. Weightlifting classes continue to complete daily workouts in the weight room. PE 1 classes perform daily fitness activities at the track. All PE classes are currently doing fitness testing (for flexibility, muscular strength & endurance, and cardiovascular endurance) as they continue to complete the Ohio Physical Education Standard Assessments.



COMPUTER SCIENCE

The Intro to Computer Science Principles class just completed the first half of our Internet unit. We've learned why the internet was created and we've explored networking hardware and protocols. Over the past two weeks, we were able to include students working from home by using an group-interactive online in-

ternet simulator to experiment with packet-switching, and the TCP and IP protocols.

This has been "LOOP WEEK" for the remaining Computer Science clas-

The Intro to Java Programming class got their first look at the syntax and application of for-loops and while-loops. We have discussed similarities and differences between the two and are now working through several lab projects to practice applying them in solving various problems.

AP Computer Science A is using loops to traverse 1-dimensional arrays. We've also been discussing other array-related topics including parallel arrays, physical size, and logical size. Students in the AP CS A course are currently working on labs which require them to use loops in the implementation of a variety of algorithms involving arrays.



The AP Computer Science Principles students are currently working through the Programming unit. This is a "language agnostic" course that focuses more on algorithms than on the implementation of a specific language so each student has been allowed to select their own language of interest. This week, we began working with the implementation of loops in Java, Python, and JavaScript.

The Game Development and Multimedia Programming class is currently in the process of creating original "multi-level, platformbased" games (think Mario Brothers). This week they learned to use loops to simulate gravity as the main character of the game jumps from one platform to another.

The Advanced Game Development group has been working independently for the past 3 weeks on their 3rd full-scale project -- a 1st -person game involving a 3D environment -- and will be presenting the final result today.

CLASSROOM AND DEPARTMENTAL NEWS

BELLBROOK ONLINE ACADEMY STUDENTS SOARING REMOTELY

This semester, due to COVID 19, approximately 160 BHS students elected to begin the year remotely as a part of the Bellbrook Online Academy. The BOA uses the Edmentum platform and is facilitated by Mrs. Bertke and MSGT Chitwood. BOA students have the opportunity to choose from over fifty courses. Courses include core subjects at both the college prep and advanced levels as well as a variety of elective courses including fashion design, game development, and computer programming. Most importantly, the program provides an alternative for families in these unprecedented times and provides a way to add a layer of safety and security regarding health concerns due to COVID 19.

The program is an independent and self-paced platform, so students plan and execute a daily schedule to accomplish their course work and also build in breaks from screen time. So

far students have done an excellent job of keeping on pace with their courses and they have learned to advocate for themselves by reaching out to their facilitators and content specialists who are BHS teachers that dedicate a duty period each day to help online students by answering questions and explaining lessons. Change is never easy. It was a steep learning curve for everyone at the start, but because of the great attitudes of students, parents, and the entire BOA team, the online academy is beginning to run like a well-oiled engine.

Seniors Be aware of upcoming college application deadlines if you are applying for early action or early decision. <u>AP Test Registration</u> Students are required to log-in to their collegeboard account and join their AP classroom. Each student was provided an AP class join code in the first week of school. Students must go into their AP classroom and denote whether you will be taking the AP test for that class. **Students must also register and pay for their AP tests in Mrs. Scohy's office**. Registration and payment for the AP tests will be open until Oct 30th! The cost is \$95 per test and checks can be made out to Bellbrook-Sugarcreek schools.

PE Waivers

A list of students who earned a PE waiver from Fall sports will be sent to the counseling office from the athletic department. As a reminder, the PE waiver is available to students in grades 9-12 participating in BHS Interscholastic Sports, Cheerleading, the Marching Band and JROTC. Students must successfully complete 2 full-seasons in one or more qualifying activities from the same area (ie: cannot mix 1 year of JROTC and 1 season of a sport). Once completed, the two PE waivers will waive the PE graduation requirement. The PE waiver does not count for a credit and is listed as a "P". Students cannot mix a PE class and a PE waiver.

<u>Seniors</u> – beware of upcoming college application deadlines if you are applying for early action or early decision. If you are applying on the common application you will need to "invite" your counselor as a recommender. Some colleges require a counselor recommendation. If a counselor recommendation is required we will need a copy of your brag sheet. If you are applying to schools that are NOT on the common application, please request a transcript using the link on the guidance webpage so we know where to send your transcripts.

Seniors should refer to the College App/Common App Folder in their Google Classroom for videos and information on completing college applications and essays.
