HIGH SCHOOL HEADLINES

Hybrid Schedule to Continue through (at least) January 15th




Bellbrook High School will continue using the hybrid model when we return from Winter Break on January 4 and will remain hybrid through at least January 15th. The district intends to return to 100% attendance on 1/19/21, if conditions allow.

BHS and BSS Schools moved to the hybrid model on November 16th in response to a dramatic increase in positive tests and soaring numbers of mandated student quarantines within the building. The move was made to allow for social distancing that would aid in slowing the spread of the virus and decrease the number of students and staff that would have to be placed in quarantine in the case of a positive test. As anticipated, the numbers of students and staff quarantined have dropped dramatically as a result.

In the two weeks prior to moving to hybrid, BHS was required to quarantine 235 students and 5 staff members due to 10 student and 2 staff positive COVID-19 cases. Since moving to hybrid we have had 5 students and 1 staff member test positive, yet we only had to quarantine 11 students and 0 additional staff members due to in-school exposure.

CLASSROOM AND DEPARTMENTAL NEWS

BHS ENGINEERING UPDATE

<u>Introduction to Engineering Design</u> students recently finished their Quarto board games in class. The students created all of the various pieces in a CAD program. They then 3D printed all of the game pieces, and laser cut/engraved all of the game board pieces as well. They have recently begun learning about multi-component assemblies and ways to document those assemblies.

<u>Principles of Engineering</u> students are wrapping up their materials and structures unit with a project requiring them to design a bridge using a bridge design CAD program. Students will apply the infor-



mation they have learned in class about materials and statics to design the most cost effective bridge that will also be structurally sound.

<u>Civil Engineering and Architecture</u> students are finalizing their Residential Design Projects. While using an architecture CAD program, they have spent all of 2nd quarter designing a house for their client while adhering to Habitat for Humanity guidelines and county code requirements.

In <u>Digital Electronics</u>, students have completed a project dealing with displaying their personalized message on a seven segment display. Upon completion of this project, students have worked on building a device that functions as a personal computer and a game emulator and also building remote controlled robots.



Aerospace Engineering students have spent the last few weeks of the semester working on a wing and airfoil project. Students researched, designed and used computer software to simulate airfoils before they used vector-drawing software and the laser cutter to build airfoils and test these airfoils in a wind tunnel. After analyzing data from the wind tunnel tests, students transitioned to building the full wings for their remote controlled plane, which they will fly with the modified wing next semester.

In <u>Engineering Design and Development</u> students are preparing for their presentations concerning their senior engineering design pro-

jects. Students spent the first semester thoroughly researching their problem, identifying the need for a problem solution beyond current solutions, and developing criteria for their problem solution. Next semester, students will design, build, and test prototypes as a solution to their problems.

STEM Club students are in a mix of two different projects. Luke Small-wood is in the final stages of creating a CAD design for a fully functional components case (inspired by the Nintendo Game Boy). The cases will be 3D printed for the Digital Electronics students to use to attach their components. Another group of students are in the initial stages of laser cutting and assembling personal document cameras (assisted with the help of BSEF) for students working remotely to use with their Chromebooks.

PSAT Results

Student scores from the PSAT/NMSQT are now available online. Students who provided their email address on their PSAT/NMSQT answer sheet will receive an email reminder from College Board explaining where and how to view their scores. Students should set up a free College Board account. https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt-psat-10/scores/getting-scores In addition, we strongly encourage students to link their collegeboard account to Khan Academy. Students will be able to get individualized SAT practice by uploading your PSAT results. Go to https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/k12-educators/advising-instruction/practice- resources/link-accounts to get started. Due to COVID, paper results are not yet available.

ACT Academy can be used for all juniors to prepare for the state-funded ACT test on Feb 23rd. Juniors were provided information on how to set-up an ACT Academy account. PreACT scores were handed out so they could be added to accounts to help guide study sessions. Please use this free resource to prepare.

PreACT - Sophomores On Feb 23rd all 10th graders will participate in a PreACT. The PreACT simulates the ACT testing experience within a shorter test window on all four ACT test subjects: English, Math, Reading, and Science. Results predict future success on the ACT test, and provide both current achievement and projected future ACT test scores on the familiar 1-36 ACT score scale. 


