Cincinnati reviews applications holistically and admits directly to major. Admission to selective programs will be very competitive and may require coursework beyond the "core curriculum." Students who wish to be considered for selective programs, the University Honors Program, or scholarships must have a complete admission file by the early action deadline. Admission to the two-year, regional colleges in Blue Ash and Clermont is "open" in most areas of study.

Test-Optional Admission: For fall 2021 and 2022, students will be able to apply to most University of Cincinnati programs with or without an ACT or SAT score. Students must indicate within their application whether they would like their score included for review and will have a brief window of opportunity to update their selection before their application is moved forward for review. If a student indicates they would like their score included in review, the test score must come directly from the testing agency.


