Bellbrook High School is located in Greene County, southeast of Dayton, Ohio. It is the high school of the Bellbrook-Sugarcreek School District. The district is rural and suburban and consists of the City of Bellbrook (population 7400) and Sugarcreek Township (population 9500). Our residents, mostly involved in business, professional and military careers, enjoy the scenic and peaceful surroundings and contribute to a strong foundation of family and community values.

Every year approximately 2 members of the senior class receive recognition in the National Merit Scholarship Program. The class of 2024 had 3 Finalists.

Faculty: There are 53 faculty members and more than 75% hold advanced degrees.

Advanced Placement: Formal Advanced Placement courses are offered in: Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, Environmental Science, Music Theory, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, English Language and English Literature, Pre-Calculus, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Government and Politics – U.S., U.S. History and Psychology. Advanced Placement Examination: In May of 2024, 191 students took 309 exams. Ninety-two percent of test takers received a 3, 4 or 5. Seventy students were recognized for an AP Scholar award and these students averaged a 4.22 on their AP tests.. Advanced Placement classes do receive weight for GPA.

Honors/Scholarship Classes: Honors level English courses are offered in the 9th and 10th grades. Scholarship courses are offered in Geometry, Algebra 2, and Physics. Grades earned in these courses do receive extra weighting for GPA.

Career Education Programs: Bellbrook High School is affiliated with The Greene County Career Center located just outside of Xenia, Ohio. The Career Center offers over 20 program choices. Bellbrook High School also offers pathways in Engineering and Biomedical Engineering through Project Lead the Way, a national pre-college engineering program.

College Credit Plus Option: In the 2023-24 school year, over 200 students took courses for college credit, both on campus at BHS and at local colleges/universities. Credit is awarded and grades are weighted in the GPA. Recent College Credit Plus courses at BHS are: Spanish III, Spanish IV, French III, French IV, Supply Chain Management, Intro to Engineering, Digital Electronics, Civil Engineering and Architecture, Engineering Development and Design, and EGR 1010.

COLLEGE INFORMATION

In the class of 2024, 88% of graduates will attend college.
