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District Updates Start Times and Busing Schedules

As the first day of school closes in, there are some changes you should be aware of.

Start and end times at the high school and middle school have changed for the 2023-24 school year, both buildings moving their times 10 minutes prior to their previous schedules.

This change was requested due to transportation issues the district was facing.

According to Transportation Coordinator Lori Smith, the move increases the available time to load the buses, leave the schools, and get to the next school at dismissal time. It also drops the average time spent on the bus for students.

"The difficulty we were having was getting one building of students home before we had to be at the next building to get those students to get them home," Smith said. That was the impetus to develop a threetiered busing schedule. That gave the district a little bit of flexibility in terms of the number of bus drivers being used, too, but it didn't fix the time factor.

The middle school will move its start time to 7:20 a.m. with dismissal at 2:20 p.m. and Bellbrook High School will move to 8:05 a.m. to 3:05 p.m. Those schools move their start and end times 10 minutes earlier than the previous year. There are no time changes at Stephen Bell Elementary or Bell Creek Intermediate.

That 10 minutes of time allows the buses to have 25 minutes to take the entire middle school building home as opposed to the 15 it had last year. With her entire staff dedicated to the middle school, though, it should put most students home (or to school) in less than 35 minutes as opposed to the 50 minutes some students

faced riding the bus last year.

"Fifty minutes is a lot of time for kids to be on the bus," Smith said. "Moving these times really allows me to get my full staff on each one of these buildings and drops their times on the bus."

Why was the district having these issues? Lack of bus drivers is one of the major factors. Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Schools, though, are not as hard hit as some others. This district has been trying to hire more drivers, but applicants for the job are few and far between.

"It really takes a unique schedule to be able to be a bus driver," Smith said. "The hours make it difficult. It has to fit in your schedule."

Another big change with busing is the available equipment on board. Recently the district invested in new cameras for buses to help catch those who are not obeying the law when it comes to passing buses while they are loading and unloading students. The district takes this matter very seriously as it can quickly become a dangerous situation.

"The bus driver's job is to safely discharge our students," Smith said. "The driver stops, checks the mirrors, turns on the lights and extends the stop arm. In a split second, they have to determine if a driver is going to run the stop sign. Our focus is 100% on the children. That makes it hard to get the information of the driver (make and model of the vehicle, color and license plate). By adding these cameras we are going to be able to capture the information."

Remember, school starts on August 17. Be aware of buses on the road making sure students arrive at their destination safely.

 - Emergency Medical Authorization
 - □ Transportation Information
 - □ Student Handbook
 - □ Acceptable Use Policy
 - □ Free and Reduced Lunch Form
 - □ Be sure School Fees and Activity Fees are paid in Payschools Central (processing fee) or at any office
 - □ If your student is an athlete, make sure those forms are filled out, too
- □ Go back to school shopping for supplies (Aug. 4-6 is the tax holiday)
 - □ Supply lists can be found at https://bit.ly/BSSsupplies
- □ Bring your student to school (or get them on the bus)
- □ Attend Open House
